

Weekly Predict assessments - 'More heart and diabetes checks'

How to use the Wall Chart

- Print it out, ideally in colour, and ideally on A3 if you can.
- Write your practice name on the chart.
- Regularly visit the Weekly Target reports within Predict and record some of your weekly results into this chart.
 - To find these, go to the 'Clinic Functions' within Predict.
 - Use the Menu on the right hand side of Predict CVD Diabetes window (within your PMS), then when the popup window opens at the Predict website; click on the '**Weekly Target**' option on the left navigation bar.

The three blue arrows show the data items which you need to take each week from this report.

- The **% screened** at the reporting date, this needs to be plotted within the graph. Put a cross showing your current %age screening rate.
- Your **weekly target**, this is the actual count which you need to do each week in order to achieve the overall 90% target within the remaining time, before the end of this financial year (end of June). **Write this into the top space on the sheet for the current week.**
- The **number of screenings** which you did last week, which had a positive influence towards achieving this year's targets. Ideally this will always be higher than the weekly target. – **Write this into the last space on the sheet for the current week.**

Practice challenge:

Put it on your wall where everyone (including the public) can see. Take pride in your participation of this public health awareness programme, encourage your patients to proactively engage with you over this Risk Assessment programme.
